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Explicit Knowledge from KM Session

1. Visiting small / large, local / international organisation to source ideas and concepts allowing students to compare what they are studying in the classroom to how people in employment use this knowledge.
2. Providing students with information about internships well before making any decisions regarding possible placements to ensure students are aware of the internship process.
3. Supporting students by organising communication between students and NUIC job supervisors as well as NUIC online internship information.
4. Encouraging students to work in multinational / international companies or to work overseas enabling students to gain a strong career focus and develop a broad knowledge of the global business world through multicultural experience.
5. Ensuring support from NUIC job supervisors and NUIC support staff involved in the internship process during the duration of the internship by maintaining close contact with their students and work place. One possible solution is to increase the use of social media such as Email, Facebook & Skype.
